



2016 Los Angeles HISTORIC NEIGHBORHOODS CONFERENCE: Growing Up With Character



Join the Los Angeles Department of City Planning and the Los Angeles Conservancy for a lively, interactive day-long forum on neighborhood conservation, including mansionization, historic and conservation districts, and community advocacy.

The theme of this year's conference is **community character**, from tree-lined streets to Historic Preservation Overlay Zones (HPOZs), and from clusters of older duplexes and bungalow courts to "background buildings" in industrial neighborhoods.

The conference is open to everyone interested in preserving and enhancing Los Angeles' neighborhoods, bringing together residents of historic neighborhoods, architects, community activists, government officials, HPOZ leaders and board members, residents of new, proposed HPOZs, and preservation leaders to share ideas and strengthen relationships.

The day will begin with a dose of humor — a special live slide show performance by showman and author **Charles Phoenix**, the "Ambassador of Americana," who will take us on a whirlwind adventure through Los Angeles' neighborhoods, exploring Google architecture, themed environments, and more!
